



## Online Fundraising Guidelines

With the creation of online fundraising sites such as: GoFundMe, Luminate Online, YouCaring and Giveforward the non-profit 501(c)3 status of Job's Daughters International must be protected. Therefore, the Board of Trustees have developed the following guidelines.

Any recognized group of JDI with a valid Employer's Identification Number (EIN) may use online fundraising for the benefit of Job's Daughters activities. Groups include:

- Grand/Jurisdictional Guardian Councils
- Grand/Jurisdictional Bethels
- Bethels Under Supreme (BUS) and Bethels in a GGC/JGC
- Prospective Members Clubs

Each JDI entity must furnish their own non-profit ID number when requested. If you are not sure what your EIN is, you must contact the Supreme Office.

According to IRS regulations, all donations received by the non-profit are to be used for the sole purpose of that entity. Examples include: the purchase of Grand/Jurisdictional/Bethel paraphernalia; Promotional events; Supplies needed for the institution of a newly forming Bethel.

A JDI entity may sponsor an individual or group of members in the performance of their position within Job's Daughters such as:

- Miss Jurisdiction
- Supreme/Grand/JGC Bethel Officers
- Bethel Officers

Allowable expenses include travel by air, train, car, or bus to local, state-wide and JDI-wide events sponsored by a recognized JDI entity. Events may include Grand Bethel, Pageant, Rally, Camp, Retreat, Annual Session of the Grand/Jurisdictional Guardian Council, and Annual Session of the Supreme Guardian Council.

***Individual members may NOT use online fundraising under the Job's Daughters heading.***
