Schedule & Confirmation Information

- Competition schedules will be provided by email approximately two (2) weeks before the competition date. Please contact the Chairperson if you do not receive your scheduled competition time by July 15, 2024.
- **Virtual Competition:** All virtual entries must upload their performance and music files by the registration deadline, June 1, 2024.
- **In-Person Competition:** Daughters performing **in person,** please check in at the Performing Arts Competition registration table approximately 15 minutes before your competition time. The registration table will be open from 30 minutes before competitions until competitions are complete.
- If you are unable to compete, please notify the Chairperson as soon as possible.

General Information for All Performing Arts Competitions

- All Performing Arts Categories are open to Daughters and Jobie-to-Bees.
- Competitors must choose to participate in *either* the Virtual or In-Person competition, not both.
- Each competitor must be registered for the 2024 Supreme Session as either an in-person or remote participant. Virtual Jobie-to-Bees may register with a Competition Only Pass.
- Job's Daughters submitting entries must be in good standing with JDI as of July 22, 2024.
- Job's Daughters must be ages 10-19 years and Jobie-to-Bees must be ages 8 or 9 years as of July 22, 2024. Candidates in the Miss International Job's Daughter Pageant who have reached the age of 20 may participate with their Jurisdiction/Bethel in <u>group</u> events ONLY (e.g. Jurisdictional Choir, Group Signing).
- Performances (all categories) must be a minimum of one minute in length and may not exceed six minutes.

- There is no limit on the number of categories you may enter.
 - For Voice and Piano, each Daughter may only enter once.
 - For the remaining competitions, there are opportunities for two (or more) entries. Each entry must be registered separately.
- There will be awards for First, Second and Third place in each category.
 - In-Person awards will be presented at the Performing Arts Showcase on Monday night.
 - Virtual Awards will be announced through JDI social media.
- A piano keyboard, music stand, CD player and Bluetooth Speaker will be available for the appropriate competitions of those girls participating in the in-person competition. Please note on your registration if you require one of these items.

The Performing Arts Gala

A gala showcasing the performing arts competitions for those **in-person competitors** will be held Monday, July 22, at 7:00 pm. A variety of performances from the competitions that day will be selected for the gala, with the list of performers being posted in the afternoon after the competitions are complete. Those asked to perform will not necessarily be those who will receive awards. You will be asked at the registration check-in if you would be willing to perform. There are a lot of very talented young people in this organization, and this is an opportunity for all of us to enjoy your talents! Please consider participating in the showcase!

 - b.) PLUS a song of choice suitable for a Masonic audience
- 4. ATTIRE:
 - a.) Daughters may wear a Bethel robe with proper regalia OR may wear attire appropriate to the musical selections.
 - b.) Jobie-to-Bees should be in attire appropriate to the musical selections.
- 5. JUDGING CRITERIA:

Judging will be based on musicality, accuracy, interpretation, expression, tempo, phrasing, dynamics, tone quality, posture, and stage presence.

6. MEMORIZATION:

Memorization of the piece is not required, but there will be bonus marks given for memorization.

- 4. ATTIRE:
 - a.) Daughters should wear a dress or skirt/slacks & blouse or a Bethel robe with proper regalia.
 - b.) Jobie-to-Bees should be in a dress or skirt/slacks & blouse.
- 5. JUDGING CRITERIA:

Judging will be based on musicality, accuracy, interpretation, expression, tempo, phrasing, dynamics, tone quality, posture, and stage presence.

6. MEMORIZATION:

Memorization of the piece is not required, but there will be bonus marks given for memorization.

7. COPIES OF MUSIC:

- a.) Competitors must provide one (1) original copy of their selected music for the judges at the time of the performance. This allows the judges to mark the accuracy of the performance.

- 1. This competition is open to individual Job's Daughters and Jobie-to-Bees performing solo dances (no groups).
- 2. Daughters may compete in more than one division (but only <u>once</u> per division).
- 3. There is no breakdown by experience, but this will be considered by the judges.
- 4. ATTIRE: Daughter should be in attire appropriate to the dance style chosen.
- 5. COMPETITION SPACE: A 16x24' hard surface dance floor will be provided.
- 6. JUDGING CRITERIA:

 Judging will be based upon choreography, use of floor area, use of body, use of music, precision, alignment, balance, interpretation, projection, creativity, costume, posture and stage presence.
- 7. NOTE: Batons or props that might damage the performance area are NOT allowed.
- 8. SONG SELECTION: Songs should be appropriate for a Masonic audience.
- 9. Maximum time limit of 6 minutes, including set up and take down of props.

- 1. This competition is open to all Job's Daughters and Jobie-to-Bees, and the category is based on level of formal training. If a member has been self-taught for several years, they are encouraged to enter based on age. *Jobie-to-Bees will be judged separately, regardless of years of experience.*
- 3. Each competitor will perform <u>TWO</u> SONGS:
 - a.) A song chosen from the JDI Music Ritual
 - b.) PLUS a song of her choice suitable for a Masonic audience
- 4. Daughter(s) must provide a copy of the lyrics of their song of choice for the judges. This allows the judges to mark the accuracy of the performance.
- 5. ATTIRE: Competitors should wear attire appropriate to their musical selections.
- 6. JUDGING CRITERIA:
 - Judging will be based upon accuracy of signs, interpretation, expression, synchronization, posture, stage presence, appropriate attire.
- 7. MEMORIZATION: Selections **must** be memorized.
- 8. All participants must be visible to the judges.

- 1. This competition is open to all Job's Daughters and Jobie-to-Bees.
- 2. Daughters may compete in each type (Dramatic, Humorous, and Duet), but only <u>once</u> per type.
- 3. Selections should be appropriate for a Masonic audience.
- 4. ATTIRE: Competitors should wear attire appropriate to the selection.
- 5. JUDGING CRITERIA:
 Judging will be based upon accuracy, interpretation, technique, expression, posture, stage presence/use of space, and appropriate attire.
- 6. MEMORIZATION: Selection **must** be memorized.
- 7. TIME LIMITS:
 - a.) Monologues: Maximum time limit of 6 minutes, including set up and take down of props.
 - b.) Duet Acting: Maximum time limit of 12 minutes, including set up and take down of props.
- 8. REQUIRED INTRODUCTION:
 - a.) At the beginning of the performance, Daughter should state the name of the selection and the author(s). This statement is <u>not included</u> in the time limitation.
 - b.) If a short explanation is necessary to give the setting, Daughter should provide an overview of the theme to be explored or establish the mood. This explanation will be included in the time limitation. This explanation may be given before the selection or between the parts of the selection at the discretion of the Daughter.
- 9. ITEMS PROVIDED: The competition will provide two chairs and a table for your use, if needed.
- 10. PROPS: Props may be used, but must not damage the competition space or other individuals.
- 11. COPIES OF SCRIPT: Please provide one (1) copy of your script for the judges at the time of your performance (e.g. published book or script, original work) so the judges can mark the accuracy of your performance. An original piece written by the Daughter is acceptable and encouraged.

 Not presenting an original copy of your script will result in a loss of points.
