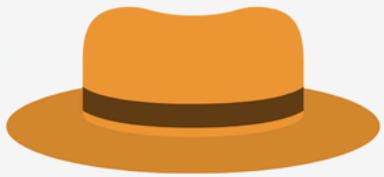

FROM Miss MO JD TO SBHQ!!

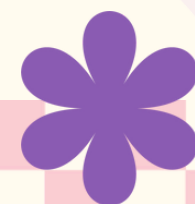

PHILIPPINES.

sinigang



Sinigang is a dish in the Filipino cuisine that goes beyond its ingredients. It speaks of home, history, culture, and a bond unspoken but shared by generations. It may seem ordinary at first glance: a clear broth with vegetables, a few pieces of meat or seafood, and a sour aroma that spreads across the kitchen. But in that bowl lie spoonfuls of memory, tradition, and the comfort only home can bring.

The dish is popularly known for its sourness which is traditionally drawn from *sampalok* (tamarind), but may also be taken from other souring agents such as guava and green mango. In most modern Filipino kitchens, powdered mixes are often used which allows easier preparation, but still perfectly encapsulates how the dish stirs memories.



Vegetables also play a vital role in ensuring that the overall flavor of the dish is kept constant. *Kangkong* (water spinach), *labanos* (white radish), eggplant, okra, and other vegetables are added just in time to be softened enough to blend in, but still keep their distinct textures and character. The choice and timings of these additions often depend on the family's personal choice. There's simply no single, fixed way of making sinigang; instead, it carries a special touch from each family member, passed down through generations.

More than its flavor, sinigang is a memory made edible. Its aroma is a constant reminder of the warmth and love in a Filipino community.

It has become a testament that life is not always sweet and easy; more often, it's sharp and unexpected. But just like the dish, it sustains –proving that even in life's tang, there is nourishment, connection, and care.

Undeniably, *sinigang* has become more than just a dish from the Philippines, but a feeling, a tradition passed down from one generation to another, and a taste of home.

INGREDIENTS



PORK BELLY
500g, cut into chunks



PORK BOULLION
1 cube



COOKING OIL
1 tablespoon



WATER SPINACH
or any leafy green



TAMARIND
6-8pcs, boiled and mashed
or 1 powder mix packet



TOMATOES
2 wholes, sliced



RADISH
1 whole, sliced



WATER
4 cups



SALT & PEPPER
to taste

① SAUTÉ

Heat oil in a pot over medium heat. Sauté onions and tomatoes until softened and fragrant.

② BROWN

Add the pork belly and cook until lightly browned. This helps develop a richer flavor.

③ BOIL

Pour in the water, then add the radish and tamarind. Bring to a boil.

④ SEASON

Add the pork bouillon cube, then season with salt and pepper to taste. Reduce heat and let it simmer for 20-30 minutes or until the pork is tender.

⑥ SERVE

Ladle into bowls and serve with rice to fully enjoy this sour comfort food!

⑤ FINISH

Once satisfied with the taste, add the leafy greens. Let them wilt for about 3-5 minutes, then turn off the heat.

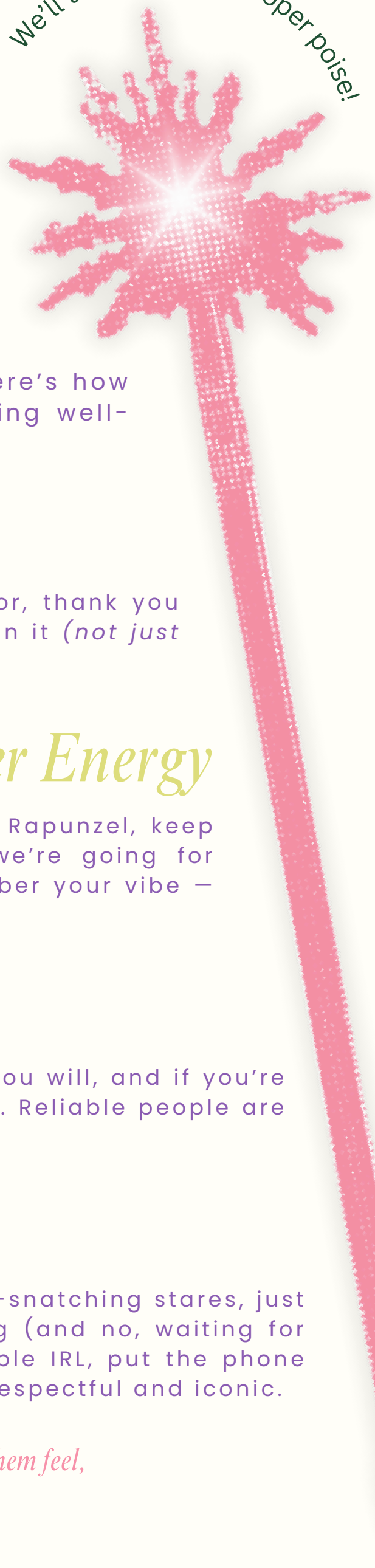

Be on Time or At Least Warn Us

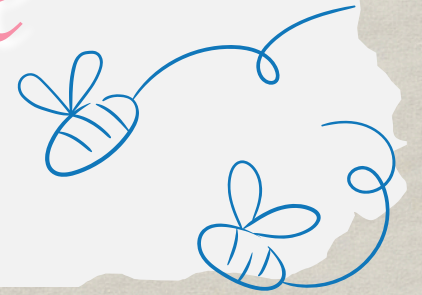

Founded on March 13, 1993, Bethel #001 Rio de Janeiro, Mater da América Latina (@bethel001riodejaneiro), marked the origin of Job's Daughters International in Brazil. At the Membership Ceremony, 64 girls became part of our legacy—some of them personally sponsored by the beloved Dad Alberto Mansur, the driving force behind Job's Daughters' presence in Brazil.

Dad Mansur not only led the effort to bring the organization to Brazil, but also collaborated with a selected team to translate the very first ritual into Portuguese, ensuring the growth of the Organization with over 280 bethels decades later, Brazil celebrates around 6640 across the country and active Daughters—carrying on the mission of shaping strong leaders guided by virtue, service, and sisterhood.

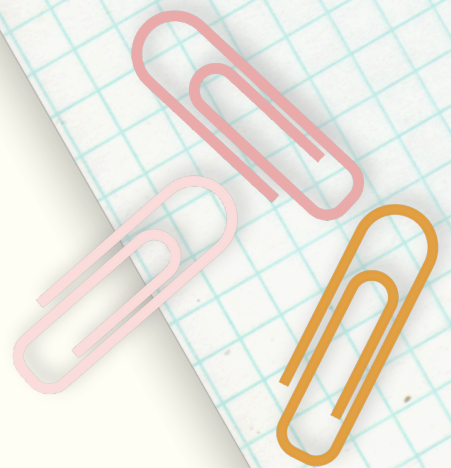
