PANCIT



If there's one thing Filipinos can agree on, it's that no celebration is complete without pancit stealing the spotlight on the table. Birthdays? Pancit. Fiestas? Pancit! Even small victories like getting a promotion or finishing a performance task somehow call for—you guessed it—pancit. It's the dish that shows up to every party like that reliable friend who never misses a gathering.

Pancit may be one of the dishes that feels naturally Filipino, but its story began long before the Philippines became the country we know today! Its roots trace back to the early Chinese traders who settled in the Philippines long before the Spanish colonization, bringing with them ingredients and cooking tools. They introduced the concept of noodles ("mien" or "pian i sit"), which later evolved into the Filipino word "pansit," meaning something cooked quickly. Since the dish was inexpensive, fast to prepare, and easy to adapt, it slowly spread from ports to towns, then from towns to households!

As the Filipino communities grew, so did their creativity. Pancit transformed from a foreign import into a deeply local expression of their identity. Every region added its own personality

Pancit Malabon with seafood and thick sauce, **Pancit Habhab** which is eaten from banana leaves, **Batil Patung** crowned with eggs, **Pancit Canton** with Chinese-style stir-frying, and **Pancit Bihon**, the classic at every Filipino event. These dishes became staples not just for taste, but for meaning.

Traditionally, long noodles also symbolized long life and good fortune, a belief carried over from Chinese culture but fully embraced by Filipino families. This is why pancit appears in almost every celebration! It is simply a reminder of hope, continuity, and blessings shared across generations. Today, pancit continues to influence the Philippine identity. It shows up in modern kitchens, fusion restaurants, and even international Filipino communities longing for a taste of home. It's a dish that has traveled far, adapted endlessly, and shared countless stories

across tables. More than just noodles, pancit is a living piece of Filipino heritage; a blend of history, tradition, creativity, and the warmth of a culture that believes food is best when shared. So, come and make a bowl of some traditional pancit with me!

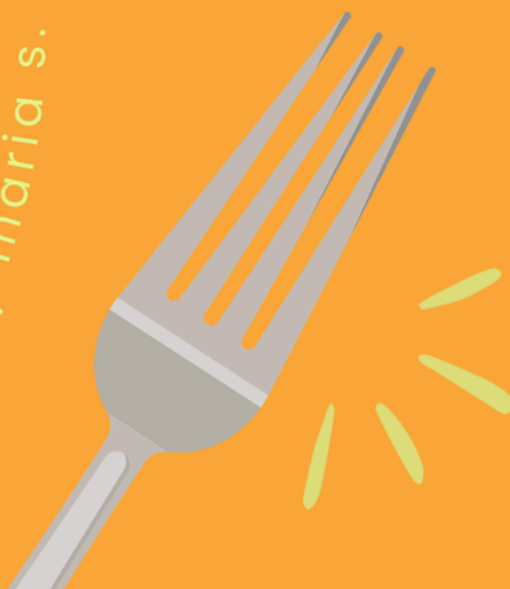


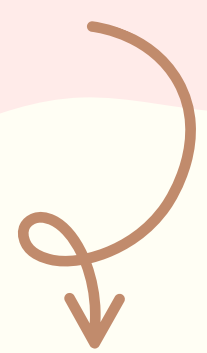

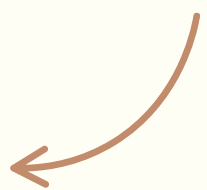
1 NOODLE PREP

Soak your pancit (if bihon) in warm water until soft and set aside.



2 SAUTE PARTY

Heat oil in a pan, saute garlic until golden and fragrant, add onions, and stir until soft.



3 PROTEIN TIME

Add your shredded chicken or pork to the pan and let it cook for 2-3 minutes.



4 VEGGIE DROP

Throw in your carrots, cabbage, and green beans, stir-fry for 2-3 minutes until soft and crunchy.



5 SAUCY MOMENT

Pour in the chicken broth, soy sauce, and oyster sauce, and let it simmer until ready.



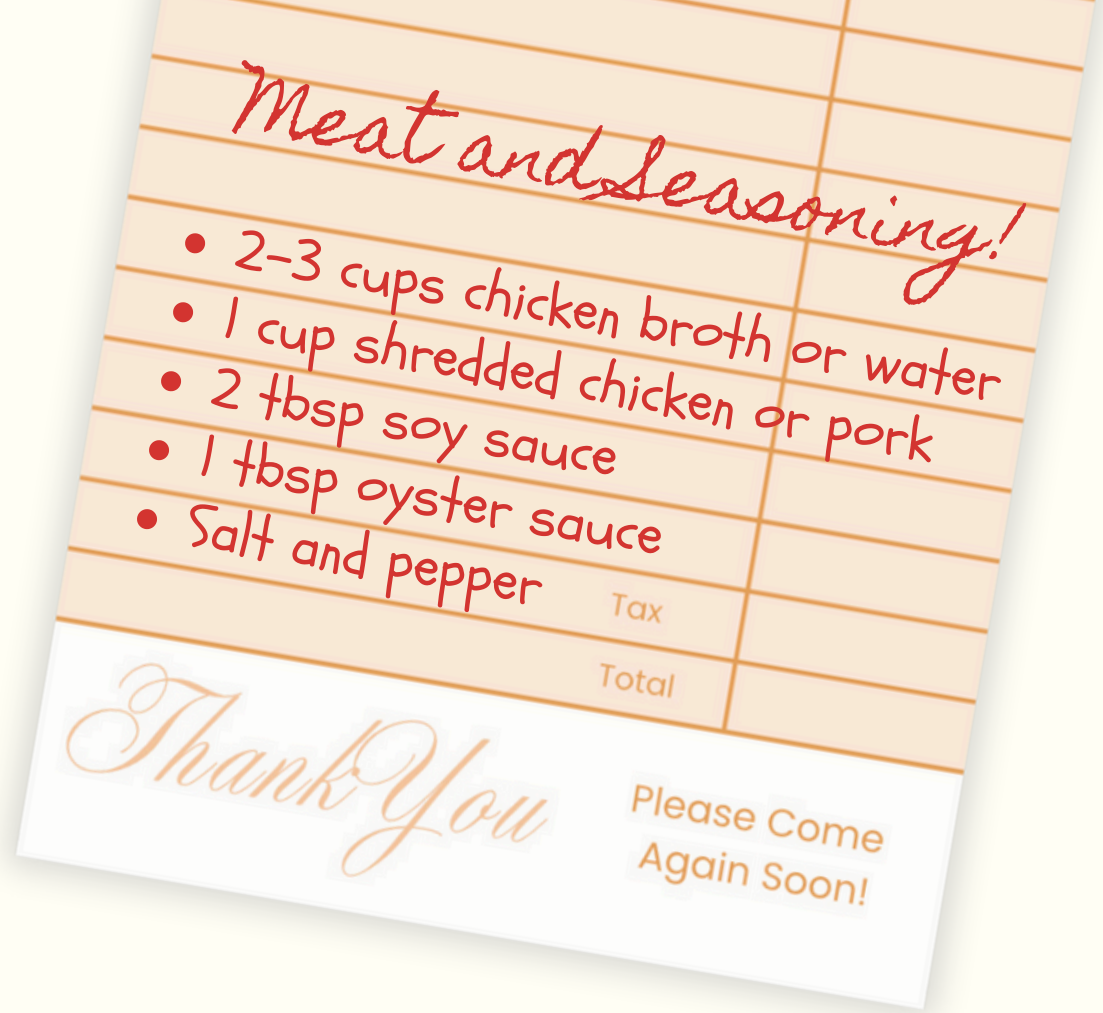
6 NOODLE DESTINY

Add your noodles into the simmering broth and toss them around until evenly coated, then season with salt and pepper, adjusting the amount of flavor by heart, like a chef.



7 FIESTA!

Transfer your pancit to a serving dish, top with the fiesta magic you want to add (calamansi, spring onions, etc.), and enjoy with the people you love!

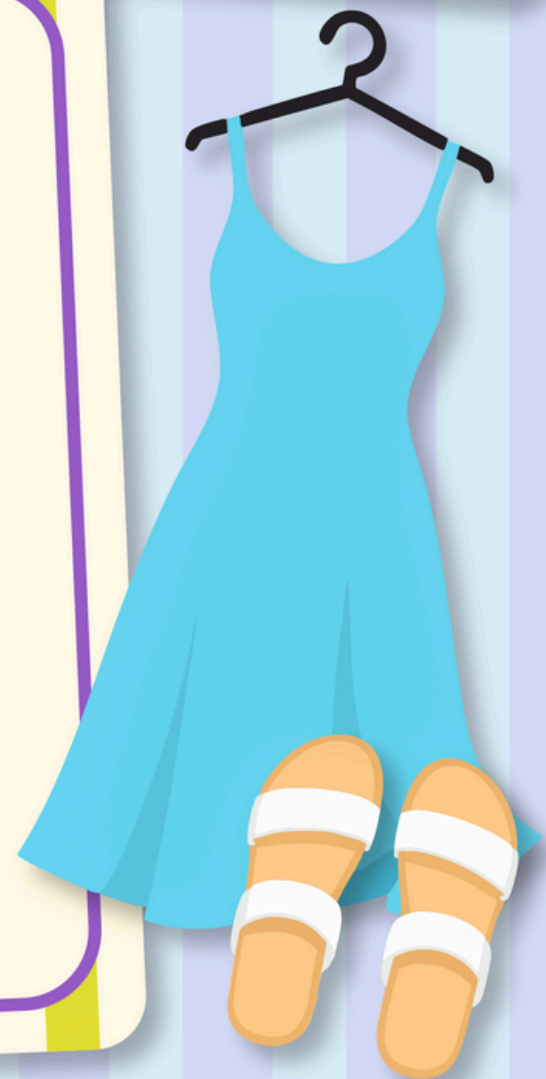

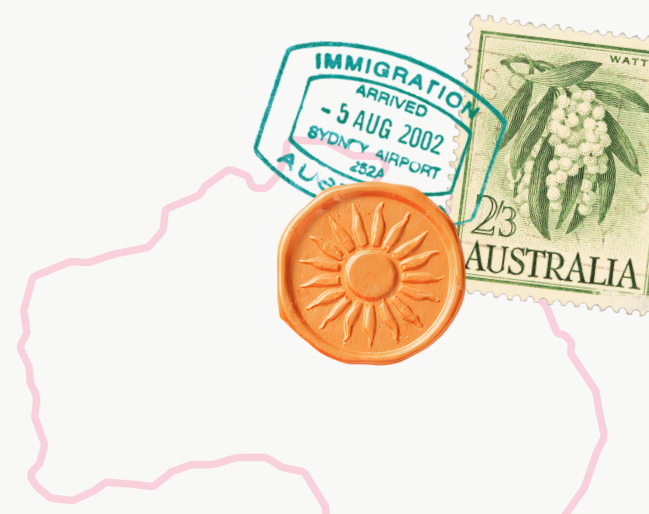



This is how it starts. That one moment of taking a picture of you and your Jobie sisters having a good time or being out in the community, and then posting it could inspire another girl to join your Bethel. However, to make sure that we are promoting Jobies in a way that intrigues rather than turns people away, we can practice mindful posting.

Mindful posting is a way to still share what happened at a fun promotion party or volunteer day with your Bethel while also being aware of when and who were posting as well as informational ways we can be using social media.

Keep it clean! When you're posting a video of you and your Jobie sisters singing or dancing to a trendy song, avoid using bad language and inappropriate dancing. Or when you're making a post, don't put any offensive language in the caption. A good general rule is that if you wouldn't say or do it in a Jobie meeting, it might not be the most appropriate thing to post!

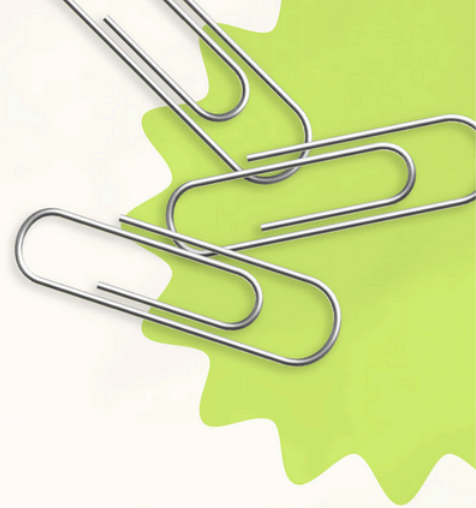
Always, Always, Always ask! When you're taking a picture with your Jobie sisters, you should always ask and make sure that it is ok that you post that content of them. This will avoid anyone having hurt feelings or finding a picture of them that they might not feel confident about. Social media is a fun and exciting place but it can also be scary, this rule can keep us safe. Also when you're advertising an event, make sure the contact is not a daughter's phone number. This is the best way to make sure that your phone number doesn't get into the wrong hands.

Personal social media pages like for a Miss or Jurisdictional/Grand Bethel Honored Queen, are incredible ways to keep people in the loop with where you have been and what you are working on. Have a philanthropic? Uploading a flyer could help spread awareness and get other Jobie sisters or members of the Masonic family to participate. You can also use social media for educating others on what a day in the life looks like in these positions. Being a state leader can often feel daunting or scary, but showing them in this way can bring much more comfort and confidence!



Step One:

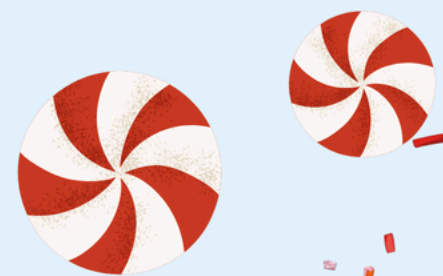

What truly makes it the best Jobie Gingerbread House is making it your own. You can use whatever candies, colors, frostings, or funky gingerbread shapes to make your home your own!

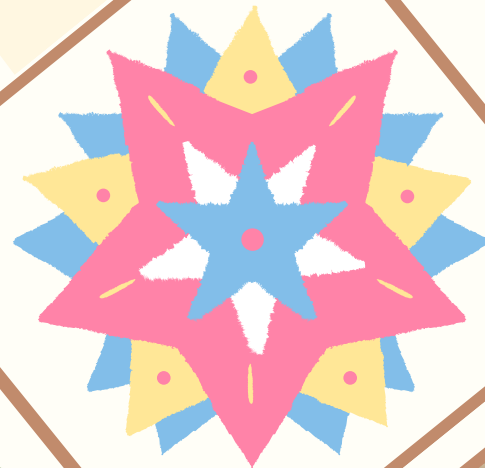
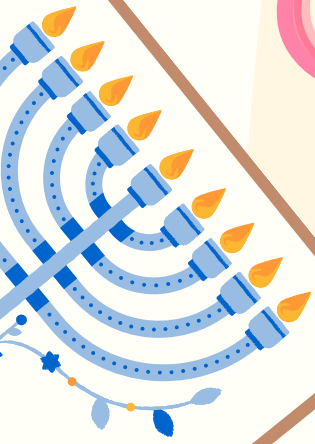

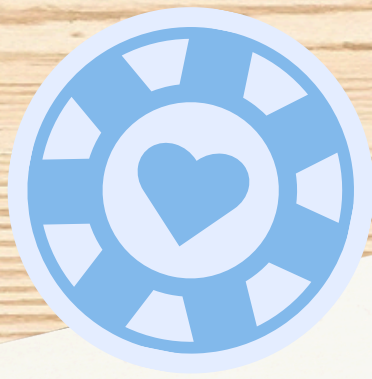

Families all over the world celebrate our favorite holidays by decorating in unique ways! 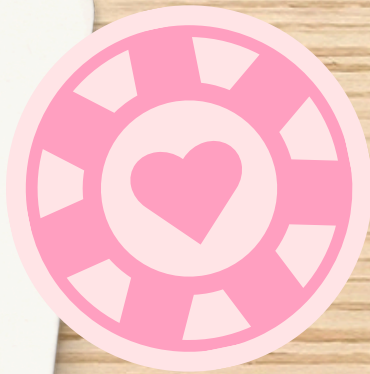
USA

Christmas comes in all shapes and sizes, and everyone celebrates Christmas in different ways. The Christmas tree has pagan origins and is a symbol of everlasting life and hope, and decorating the tree became popular in the Victorian era. People decorate them with colorful ornaments, either like glass balls or in fun shapes. Some traditions include hiding various objects like pickles or candy canes for kids to find and win a prize.



Australia

Taking a trip down under, where the sun shines in the middle of December, they still decorate with a Christmas tree, lights and tinsel. However, Aussies also highlight some native flowers including Christmas bush and Christmas bellflowers that bloom only around Christmas. Some families even decorate backyard gum trees with lights as part of their celebrations.



Canada

Canadians also celebrate by decorating their Christmas trees with colorful ornaments. However, they also like to decorate their houses with extra wreaths and firs to help bring in some extra holiday cheer. Keeping the house full of the greenery from the outside.





Philippines


One of the most iconic Christmas decorations for Filipinos is the parol, which is a star shaped lantern meant to symbolize the star of Bethlehem, an event that symbolizes hope, divine guidance, and the fulfillment of prophecy. A parol is traditionally made with bamboo and thin translucent tissue paper. Modern versions include plastic and metal with LED lights. Filipinos also usually have nativity scenes, which are little scenes that depict the birth of Jesus Christ, and of course, the classic Christmas tree.



Brazil

Although Brazil is much warmer, they still follow the same decorating traditions as their northern sisters. Christmas trees strung with lights and ornaments as well as a nativity scene. However, they like to have a visit from Santa himself, with some help from a fun relative! Many also play a game of 'secret friend' where they purchase one special gift for a friend that they choose from a drawing, making their Christmas extra special.





In Job's Daughters, many families also celebrate Hanukkah, where they decorate with the Menorah. Whereas the eight days of Hanukkah pass, they light a candle to remember another day the oil burned for, which is meant to symbolize the miracle of the fire after a rebellion recaptured a temple after Judaism was banned. They also decorate blue, white and silver throughout their homes as well as using gold to help accent the star of David.

In the Philippines, Rizal day celebrated on December 30 celebrates the life of one of the nation's greatest heroes. It is meant to celebrate the fight for independence and the celebration of Filipino culture and heritage. As a result, many families hang up flags or wreaths in his honor.

In Brazil and Australia, the end of the calendar year often means the end of the school year or the beginning of summer vacation. While our sisters in the Northern Hemisphere celebrate the end of the year bundled up in winter gear and making snowmen, our sisters in the southern hemisphere celebrate by kicking it back and lounging by the beach.

Many families also celebrate with advent wreaths or calendars throughout the year. Many of our Catholic sisters celebrate by placing candles in a circle, surrounded by a pine wreath or pine branches. They decorate to count down the days to Christmas and to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. In recent years, many sisters count down with advent calendars. Whereas the days leading up to Christmas, they receive a piece of chocolate or a little trinket from a pre made, or homemade, advent calendar.

Decorations are a beloved tradition by all and are a staple in many households. Although we are united by holidays, we are still unique in how we celebrate and prepare our homes for the upcoming season. Maybe some of these decorations helped inspire you to try something new this year!

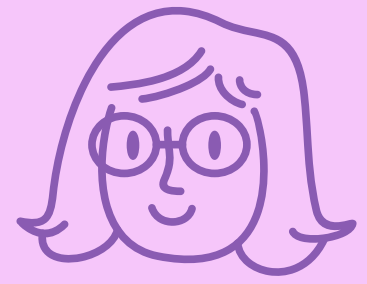
